



#### Curriculum

To give a global perspective in all areas of development is the centerpiece of our school's education system. It provides a broad-based educational opportunity that develops students' understanding of various disciplines and languages and their ability to lead, participate and contribute in a rapidly changing global society. The school follows CBSE curriculum. CBSE (Central Board of Secondary Education) is a board that is universally recognized and accepted by institutions of higher learning throughout the world. The school is affiliated to the CBSE.

## **Foundation Years**

#### Kindergarten Section (KG1 – KG3)

At the pre-primary level, our focus is on developing English language communication; Fine & Gross Motor skills; and Social and Emotional development. The introductory subjects include English, Mathematics and EVS. Second language option is given in KG 3, in order to have a proper understanding of it once they get promoted to grade 1. These are supported by regular activities and projects, art and craft, music, aerobics, yoga etc. The students are also introduced to basic computer skills. The learning experience, through play-way and audio-visual teaching methods, is made more fun and interactive.

#### Lower Primary (Grade I – II)

School recognizes that students achieve their best when they feel safe, nurtured, welcomed, respected and included. We are committed to provide a healthy learning and working environment to support student success by promoting responsibility, respect, civility, academic excellence and good citizenship.

#### **Upper Primary (Grade III – V)**

The curriculum emphasizes on overall skill development comprising of moral values and human ethics through Value Education and Islamic Studies. As these are the foundation years in a child's life, focus is laid in mainstream subjects like Math, Science, English, EVS, etc. through a child friendly education system.

#### Middle School (Grade VI – VIII)

Middle school precedes the high school. It is the preparatory stage for the students to get ready for the challenges of life in terms of holistic and scholastic education. In addition to academic growth and development, emphasis is laid on overall physical and mental development through other co- curricular activities.

#### Secondary School (Grade IX – X)

#### The Two Assessments to be conducted in grade X comprises of:

PS: The CBSE Board will be conducting the final examination of 80 Marks in each subject. 10% of the whole year assessment in each subject will be considered by the board for the internal assessment. 5% of the evaluation will be for the projects/ lab practical's and remaining 5% will be from classwork and homework.

## **PROMOTION**

- 1. Promotion of the pupil is granted on the basis of the whole year's performance; hence the regularity in attendance and work is essential.
- 2. A detailed report of students studying in lower primary and upper primary section will be given by the home room teacher during Parent Teacher Interaction.
- **3.** The following rules as directed by the CBSE will be strictly followed in all the classes.

40 % aggregate marks should be obtained by the pupil to be promoted to the next grade.

#### 4. Promotion Policy in Grade IX – X

The guidelines given by the CBSE will be strictly followed. Two languages, Mathematics, Science & Social Science will be considered at par for the promotion purpose.

Consistent neglect of the academic work will be condoned. In view of the system of periodic tests and the year's average in determining eligibility for promotion, it will not be possible to hold makeup exams.

A student must secure overall 40% marks to seek promotion to the next class. It is mandatory to score minimum 35% marks (exclusively in theory) in each subject to be promoted to the next class, i.e. Grade X.



## **AWARDS**

- 1. The students of Grades I V will be awarded a certificate of merit in various subjects.
- **2.** Achievement Certificates will be awarded to the distinguished students who have secured 90% or more in their respective classes (All sections).
- **3.** In case, a child does not appear for Summative Examination due to any reason, he/she will not be eligible for commendation certificates.
- **4.** Prize / Certificate for recognition in co-curricular activities is awarded for group as well as individual outstanding performance

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#### HOUSE SYSTEM AND COMPETITIONS (Grades KG-X)

The School is divided into four houses recognised by four colours Sahara (Red), Arabian (Yellow), Thar (Blue) and Tabernas (Green). All students from grades KG to X are placed in one of these Houses.

Each House is headed by a House Captain and has Prefects. A member of the staff, assisted by several other teachers shall act as the House Master/Mistress. Points are awarded to the houses throughout the year for Inter-House Competitions in the extra - curricular activities, games and sports. At the end of the year, the house gaining the highest number of points is awarded the Dunes Trophy.

## SCHOOL RULES

## (General Rules)

- 1. Students must carry their Organizer to School every day with their photograph properly pasted and the complete identity information duly signed by the parent. The parents are expected to peruse the contents of the organizer and fill in the required entries on specified pages.
- 2. Students who come to School by their own transport must arrive the School before the morning bell rings.
- **3.** Student's appearance must be tidy and they should be neatly dressed. The School uniform is to be worn every day and for all School functions. Students who are sloppily dressed or are not in the complete uniform will not be allowed to attend school.
- 4. Boys must get their hair cut at regular intervals. Girls must neatly make plaits or dress their hair according to the length.
- 5. Shouting or whistling is not allowed in the School premises/buses.
- 6. Students are expected to respect the property of others. This includes respect for School property. No student should damage any School furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the Class Teacher. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it. Anyone who notices something damaged, must report the matter even if he or she does not know who has done it.
- **7.** Students are not permitted to bring any sharp instruments to School.

- **8.** Students are advised to keep their classroom/school building/campus as neat as possible and throw leftovers into the dustbin only.
- 9. Lending or borrowing of money and other articles is not permitted.
- **10.** The School is not responsible for any loss of goods. It is, thus, not advisable to bring valuable articles (such as expensive watches, jewellery, electronic gadgets etc) to School.
- **11.** Students must observe polite standards wherever they go. They should always remember that the School is judged by the behaviour of its students. Students should always wish their teachers when they meet them. Use of foul language and bullying are punishable offences.
- **12.** Students should have team spirit and a feeling of brotherhood among their fellow students. They should be enthusiastic and eager in their approach towards helping others.
- **13.** The School reserves the right to suspend or take strict disciplinary action against a student whose performance in studies is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.
- **14.** Parents and guardians should not visit their wards or teachers in the classrooms, without the permission of the Principal. As far as possible, once a child has come to school, he/she should not be asked to return home early.
- **15.** The School provides education from Pre-Nursery to Grade X. It is the senior's duty to treat the juniors with love and affection and in turn the juniors should respect their seniors.
- **16.** No student shall indulge in any of the following practices:
  - a. Spitting within the school premises.
  - b. Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property.
  - c. Smoking.
  - d. Any form of gambling.
  - e. Use of drugs or intoxicants.
  - f. Unruly and rude behaviour.
  - g. Use of violence in any form / groupism or vandalism.
  - h. Casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability.
- **17.** The observance of rules of discipline of the School and good behaviour is an essential prerequisite for the students to continue in the School. In case any student violates the School rules or indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict action such as expulsion/suspension shall be taken against the student.

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- **18.** It is necessary for parents/guardians to keep track of the progress of their ward(s) by contacting their respective teachers on the specified PTM dates. They are requested to visit the school's website to follow up with the progress.
- **19.** A child who is detained in a class twice will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school.
- **20.** A student who uses unfair means during tests will be given zero in the subject and a warning letter. Repetition of the same will result in dismissal.
- **21.** Students using the school bus should always maintain discipline in the bus . Bus facility will be withdrawn in case the student is found undisciplined.
- **22.** Disobedience, indiscipline and arrogant behaviour will not be entertained.
- **23.** Systematic and proper planning in terms of their academic excellence is expected from the students.
- 24. Students are strictly forbidden to wear any junk jewellery or accessories during school hours. They should be simple and decent in their outward expression. Students should avoid loitering around the school corridors or in any other part of the school premises.
- **25.** Mobile phones are strictly prohibited during school hours. In case of any emergency, the student can call home from the School office only after taking permission from the School authorities.
- **26.** Students are encouraged and advised to maintain a balance between their academic achievement and extracurricular activities.
- **27.** If a student is injured during the school hours in the campus, the Doctor in charge will administer first aid at the infirmary immediately and all efforts shall be made to notify the parents immediately. All minor injuries will be treated at school unless the school is directed by the parents to do otherwise. Parents are required to keep school updated with the change in contact/phone numbers if any.
- 28. Any damage to school property will lead to fine/disciplinary action.
- **29.** Direct criticism or complaints of faculty will not be entertained. In case of genuine grievances, the parents must see the Principal immediately on appointment.
- 30. The school reserves the right to add or amend school rules time to time.

## **RULES FOR ABSENTEEISM**

- **1.** A student who has been absent on the previous day will not be allowed to enter the class without a letter from the parent, addressed to the Class Teacher, stating the reason of absence.
- **2.** Parents must fill up the 'Record for Non-Attendance' for each day's absence from the School stating the valid reasons.
- **3.** Students who have been medically unfit / sick must provide a medical certificate from their doctor on joining the school.
- 4. A student, returning to School after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, must produce a doctor's certificate permitting him/her to further attend classes. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class
  - a. Chicken Pox-till complete falling of the scabsb. Cholera-till the child is completely wellc. Measles-two weeks after the rash disappearsd. Mumps-until the swelling has gone, about one monthe. Whooping Cough-six weeksf. Jaundice-six weeks after recoveryg. COVID-19-till the child is completely well
- **5.** Students who require medical attention during school hours must be sent to the school clinic by the teacher with the clinical record in the organizer.
- 6. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than six consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only after payment of a fresh admission fee.
- **7.** All students are expected to attend School on the opening day after the vacations. Those absent because of sickness must present a medical certificate before entering the class.
- **8.** It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of the attendance in the year to make them eligible to sit for the final examination. The percentage, however, could be relaxed on medical grounds; but such students will not be eligible to receive any prizes.

## LATE ARRIVAL IN SCHOOL

The School gate is closed 10 minutes after the first bell.

A "Late Entry Slip" must be filled in the school office before the student goes to the

class. Three late arrivals in a month would lead to a 'Put on Report Card'.

#### EARLY EXIT

A Proforma available in the front office is to be filled by the parent and duly signed by the Principal, before 1:20 PM for Grades I to X and before 11:45 AM for the KG Section.

## **WITHDRAWALS**

- 1. One calendar months' notice in writing must be given before a pupil is withdrawn from the school. Whenever the child is withdrawn the fees for that particular term is to be paid. Even if the withdrawal is intended at the end of the academic session, one month's prior notice is mandatory.
- **2.** Those who leave the School in May, must in all cases, pay the fees for the month of June and July.
- 3. Transfer certificates will not be issued until all dues of the School are settled.
- 4. Students can be asked to leave the School on the following grounds:
  - a. Indiscipline
  - **b.** Unsatisfactory progress in work
  - c. Detention or repeated detentions in a class.
  - d. Exceptionally prolonged illness

#### DISCIPLINING

**Put on Report Card** – Being on "Put on Report Card" is a punishment used for unsatisfactory, careless and untidy work in academics. Typically, a student is given a report card, which he or she carries to class at school. After each lesson, the teacher in charge completes and signs on the card confirming the student's presence during the lesson and commenting on his or her attitude. In some cases, there will also be a place for a senior teacher and the student's parent or guardians to confirm that they have read the report at the end of each day. Different grades of report will be issued to the student, reflecting the seriousness of the punishment. A student may be placed on report for a fixed time period, such as a week, or until his/her behavior improves. Their parents may also voluntarily place them on report.

Serious offences which reflect adversely on a student's conduct (e.g. breaking bounds, disobedience, telling lies) can lead to the award of a Conduct Card which deprives the offender of availing of any privilege in the School for a week. She/ He is not allowed to attend any programme, picnic or outings or buy any food/ drinks from the canteen while on a Conduct Card. The award of three Conduct Cards in an academic year in quick succession may lead to the expulsion of the offender from the school on disciplinary grounds.

**Other forms of Disciplinary Measures** – The following shall be the disciplinary measures, which may be adopted by the School in dealing with all the students:

- **a.** Detention during the break.
- b. Fine
- c. Suspension
- **d.** Expulsion
- e. Written Detention

In case of gross indiscipline and misbehaviour, the Principal is authorised to take a decision about suspension/expulsion of a student from the school.

## **SCHOOL TRANSPORT**

Students can avail School Transport subject to the availability of seats. The routes of the School buses are drawn up once parents consult the transport in-charge with necessary details. It is not obligatory on the part of the school to provide transport to all the students desirous of this facility.

#### **BUS RULES**

- 1. All the students using the School bus are expected to be ready at the bus stop at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- 2. The buses will not wait for latecomers.
- 3. The children should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
- **4.** No student should come near the entry door of the bus until it has made a complete stop.
- 5. All the students must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding their buses.
- 6. When the bus is in motion, students must not move around in the bus and no part of their body should be outside the bus.
- 7. Objects of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown outside the bus.
- Students will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by negligence or vandalism.
- 9. No student is allowed to eat or drink in the bus.
- **10.** Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.
- **11.** The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
- **12.** The student bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal.

## SCHOOL BOOK SHOP

Books and articles of stationery shall be issued by the school book shop as a set at the time of joining. Any requirements thereafter may be purchased by the parents/students from the bookshop.

For the purpose of uniformity, students are required to buy exercise books of the standard design, bearing the name of the school from the School Book Shop.

Parents are advised to send proper tiffin for their wards daily

## SCHOOL LIBRARY

- Silence should be observed at all times.
- Tating, drinking and playing inside the library is strictly prohibited.
- Students should not bring their bags, sports equipments, tiffins, water bottles etc. in the library.
- Treat the books and other materials with care.
- Books other than reference books are issued for one week. If the books are overdue, a fine of SR 1/- per day will be charged. Repeated late returns will result in the borrowing facility being withdrawn for one month.
- Books and other materials should not be taken out of the Library without permission from the Librarian.
- To bring their personal books to the library.
- Twiting, tearing pages or any form of defacement of books is strictly prohibited.
- Students should not leave the books on the table after using them. They should return them at the counter.
- Place the chairs back properly before leaving.

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## **GOOD PARENTING**

To get the best from the school for your child, you are advised to maintain close contact with the school. We earnestly recommend that parents/guardians should look into their ward's organizer every day and see that the lesson and homework assigned for the day is done. The student should be encouraged to cultivate the habit of doing their work regularly and neatly. Remarks put down in the organizer should be seen and countersigned regularly.

It also includes:

- 1. Showing proper respect towards school authorities that includes Principal, Head Master, Head Mistress, Teachers and others.
- 2. Maintain the dignity of school in front of their children and masses.
- 3. Using sophisticated/decent language while interacting with teachers during PTMs and otherwise.

If you feel that your ward is not making the desired progress, the Class Teacher/Subject Teacher / Headmaster / Headmistress / Principal may be contacted with prior permission from the front desk.

Children will not be allowed to go home during school hours. Parents are requested not to make any social engagements or medical appointments during school working hours. In order to ensure better discipline, parents are requested not to send their children to school on the day of any such appointments.

In case of any infectious disease at your home please report the fact at once and do not send your ward to attend the class until the infectious period is over.

As the medium of instruction is English, student should be helped and assisted to follow their work easily and intelligently by a certain amount of regular conversation in English at home. This will improve and enhance his/her communication skills.

#### Additional Check list:

- 1. Check for haircuts, neatness of uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning.
- **2.** See that your ward carries books/exercise books according to the timetable for that day. No extra books are allowed.
- 3. See that your ward is prepared for the class tests, formative /summative exams
- **4.** Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- 5. Restrict daily pocket money. Excessive spending should be discouraged.
- 6. No student will be allowed to go home without the written permission of the Principal.
- **7.** Your ward should be instructed to be careful about his/her belongings. Expensive articles such as mobile phones, MP3 players, laptops, iPods, calculators, etc.

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Should not be brought to the School. Students are also not allowed to wear expensive jewellery to the School. In case of violation of this rule, the articles will be confiscated. The School bears no responsibility for any loss of such articles in the School.

- 8. If your ward is absent from School, he/she must make up for all the work missed by him/her.
- **9.** If your ward is to leave the School campus during School hours, he/she must bring a letter explaining the reason and must obtain a gate pass from the Principal. This must be presented to the Class Teacher at the time of leaving.
- **10.** All the parents are requested to impart Health Education so that they:
  - **a.** maintain personal hygiene of their children such as trimming of nails and be neat on a regular basis
  - **b.** To ensure that their child sleeps for at least eight hours daily.
  - c. To ensure that the children bring their own water bottles from home.
  - **d.** To ensure that they deworm their children at least once a year.
  - e. Get dental and ophthalmic check-up every year by a dental surgeon and ophthalmologist respectively
  - f. Immunise all children as per schedule given below:
    - (i) Covid-19
    - (ii) BCG
    - (iii) Diphtheria
    - (iv) Oral Polio
    - (v) Measles / MMR
    - (vi) DT at 5 years of age
    - (vii) Tetanus booster dose to be given at the appropriate age and also to be given if injured.
    - (viii) Typhoid
    - (ix) Cholera
    - (x) Hepatitis
    - (xi) Meningitis
- **11.** Students suffering from diseases such as Covid-19, Chicken Pox, Cholera, Measles, Mumps, Whooping-Cough and Jaundice must observe the prescribed period of quarantine as mentioned under the heading 'Rules for Absenteeism' in the Organizer.

**12.** Students suffering from infectious diseases such as Conjunctivitis, Dermatitis, Scabies, etc. should not be sent to School.

**13.**Students suffering from chronic diseases such as Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic Heart Disease, etc. are advised to be under continuous Medical supervision of a Specialist. History of their illness must be filled up in the Organizer along with the treatment being taken.


